A notice was recently issued to the International Air Transport Association (IATA) staff that its two largest offices in Montreal and Geneva would be combined into one Head Office situated in Geneva. This will result in most of IATA's current activities in Montreal transferring to Geneva. This decision will also mean that nearly all of the current office space will soon be vacated including the space rented by WACA. A final rental agreement between IATA and WACA has, therefore, been signed up to the end of 2021. It will not be an easy task to vacate the premises in such a short time frame. Sorting, storing, scanning 50 years of files, minutes, legal and financial records

etc. will be no easy task not to mention the migration of WACA's domain name and all that this entails. Transfer of data, e.g. e-mails, images, electronic documentation, etc. from IATA's server to another host server will also be an important task that has to be undertaken as well as changing the address and telephone number.
